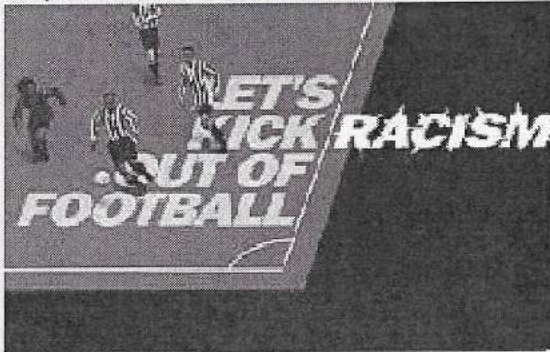

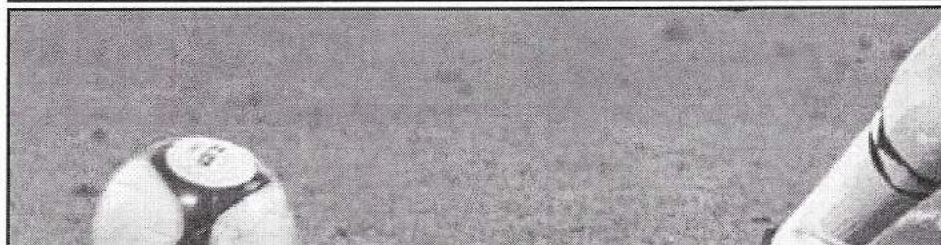

End To End Stuff with Les Scott

COINCIDENCES

The scorer of England's first goal against Scotland in the international of 1900-01 was Blackburn of Blackburn (Fred Blackburn played for Blackburn Rovers).

Bolton Wanderers can boast two players who, on leaving the club, entered politics with the same party. In 1913, full-back Jack Slater became a Conservative Party activist and was elected Member of Parliament for Eastbourne. In the 1960s, full-back Roy Hartle became a Tory activist and was elected as a councillor for the Halliwell Ward in Bolton.

In 1920, Chelsea signed three players from Queens Park Rangers: David Cameron, Ken McKenzie and John Bell. When their playing days were over they all became doctors. The joke was, when they signed autographs no one could decipher the writing, except chemists, who told them to come back in ten minutes.

1922-23, Southampton finished mid-table in Division Two; their record read won 14, drawn 14, lost 14, goals for 40, goals against 40, 42 points from 42 matches. During the season Southampton were awarded four penalties and conceded four penalties.

In 1926, Tom McDonald of Newcastle United set a new record for the number of goals scored by a defender in a single game when he netted a hat-trick against Cardiff City. On 21 April 1934 his record was equalled by William Imrie, also playing for Newcastle (against Wolves).

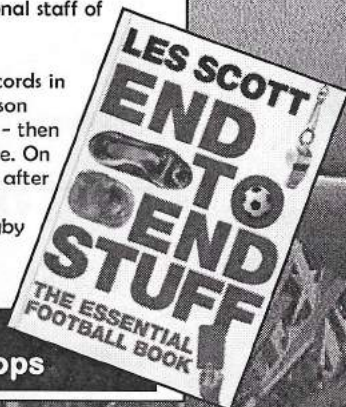
In 1926-27 Cecil Smith and James Smith both scored in 13 successive matches for Wrexham, who finished the season in 13th place in Division Three North.

On Christmas Day 1936, not one of the 11 matches in Division One was won by the away team. The fixtures were reversed for the following day (Boxing Day) and again, not one match was won by the away team.

In 1937-38, Wolverhampton Wanderers had a professional staff of 40 players and not one was married.

Villa Park was once the home of the fastest scoring records in both football and rugby. On 3 December 1938, Bob Iverson scored after only nine seconds against Charlton Athletic - then the fastest recorded goal in history of the football league. On 17 September 1947, a touring Australian XV scored a try after only seven seconds of their match against a Midlands Counties XV - at the time the fastest recorded try in rugby union in England.

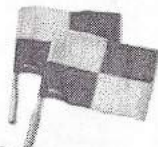
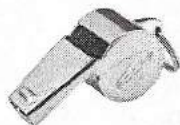

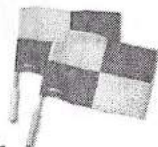
