
HALL OF FAME

Jerry Welch started off as Liden United club linesman back in the early 80's in the Saturday District League. He got more involved with the club soon winning promotion to the Wilts County league, but as players left the remainder joined up with Oldacre Reserves to form Genesis with Jerry as Team Manager. They had a run of success winning District Div 1 and Premier titles in the early 90's. Jerry also ran a decent Sunday League side, Gamekeeper at this time. He joined the District league committee in 1993, becoming Vice Chairman in 1999, and elected Chairman in 2004 the role he kept to this day. He accepted a role on the Wilts FA Council in 2000 and served on many sub-committees.

Jerry touched the lives of many in football, where he gained respect for his hard work and friendly nature. Our thoughts and condolences go out to his family as we remember his longstanding love and dedication to our game. Rest in Peace Jerry.

Robert (Bob) Warman born 1938 in London and on moving to Swindon dedicated 40 years of his time to the Swindon & District Football League, firstly as a referee, and having joined the District committee in 1995 became referee appointments secretary 15 years ago. Refereeing in Swindon is a poorer place with Bob's passing.

Bob was committed to supporting young referees and grassroots football and supported and inspired many to take on refereeing. He was a true legend and a real gentleman in all that was football. You will be sadly missed.

HISTORY

The George Thomas trophy was funded 22 years ago by his wife in memory of the Swindon & District chairman, who had been a stalwart of the League and local football for over 50 years, joining the committee in 1951, becoming chairman in 1962 and President in 1983. Don Rogers is rightly known far beyond Swindon, famously for his contribution in putting the Arsenal of 1969 in their place. In 412 appearances for Swindon in two spells between 1961 and 1977, Don scored 149 goals.
